



## Terms and conditions of use

### Level 1

The use of all data that are available without logging in at the PAN-website is permitted under the licence of *Creative Commons 4*.

CC4 means that the user is permitted to copy and share the open content of PAN, and to perform new studies based on PAN-content, under the following conditions:

- Attribution: The user must mention 'Portable Antiquities of the Netherlands' as source of the PAN-data, followed by an url to the website as a whole if the reference is to general data, or to an url of an object or a reference type if reference is made to a specific object or object type.
- NonCommercial: you may not use the material for commercial purposes.
- ShareAlike: if you use PAN-data you must distribute the resulting studies and other products under the same licence.

### Level 2

In addition to level 1 there are restrictions in place for reproducing data that are available only after logging in at the PAN digital database at researcher level.

- 2.1 Publication of exact find locations is not allowed. 'Exact find location' means here an indication on a map, in words and/or in numerical coordinates on the basis of which third parties can find the plot on which the find was retrieved. For scientific publications, the use of place and toponym is allowed.
- 2.2 It is not allowed to include exact find locations in a database or other digital application where it can be used by third parties.
- 2.3 An exception to regulation 2.1 is applicable if PAN is not the source of the information about the find location. This exception is valid if a find location is already published in one or more generally accessible publications or in case the findspot is designated by a government organization or a university as a subject of archaeological research on parcel-level. In those cases PAN-find locations may be presented in word or in writing, on the condition that the source of the information about the find location (other than PAN) is clearly presented.
- 2.4 For possible exceptions to this rule permission from the PAN-project lead must be asked and granted before publication.
- 2.5 It is not allowed to share information, written or spoken, about exact findspots with non-professionals [oude 2.1 t/m 2.3 doornummers]
- 2.6 Names and/or aliases (chosen names) from finders/ reporters, that may be shown on the screen, are not stored and/or reproduced in any way
